At St Peter's we aim to instil a sense of 'Pride' in our children and this includes the uniform that they wear that represents our school. Whilst we understand that there may be times when part of a child's uniform is missing we cannot accept poor attention to our uniform guidelines on a regular basis. If there is a problem with an article of clothing (eg broken shoes that need to be replaced, an item of clothing that has been lost) we expect parents/carers to inform us of this and replace the missing items as soon as possible. If appropriate uniform is not worn and parents have not notified us of this a text may be sent to parents/carers, followed by a letter and possible meeting with the headteacher if the issue does not resolve itself.

Where a child does not have appropriate uniform, we will provide items of uniform if they are available and text the parents/carers to let them know of the issue. If the uniform is still not provided we will send a letter home and as a last resort we may contact the parents for a meeting to discuss this.

At St. Peter's, we aim to promote each child's right to express their gender and personality in whichever way feels right for them. To support this aim, our

uniform policy is gender neutral. This means that, whilst we expect all of our children to wear school uniform, the rules for boys and girls are the same and we do not insist that they wear specific items of clothing.

Book Bag



A book bag is provided when children start school in Reception class. If you are joining the school at a later stage, the book bag should be purchased from Channel Uniforms or from the school office. Due to fire regulations and our current risk assessment, back packs are not permitted due to their size and the space they take up in our small cloakroom areas. If clothes are required for clubs, these should be provided in a small drawstring sports bag or carrier bag, with your child's name on.

Important Notes regarding uniform

- The cardigan, jumper, PE t-shirt, PE shorts and tie all need to be purchased from Channel Uniforms.
- Other items of the school uniform can be bought from supermarkets or high street shops.
- The back jogging bottoms must be completely plain black and should not have visible logos/branding.
- If choosing to wear a black trainer instead of traditional black school shoes, these must be completely plain. No coloured logos or additional colour.
- Children in EYFS (Reception Class) have a separate uniform policy.
- Please make sure all items of uniform are named, so that they can be returned easily if they are misplaced.

Parents' ability to afford school uniform must not put children at a disadvantage, therefore where parents are not able to afford to purchase school uniform, they should speak to the Headteacher about what support may be available.
